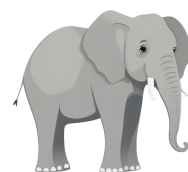


# How to Use Articles (A/An/The)

## Rules:

- "A" is used before singular, countable nouns that begin with a consonant sound.  
Example: a cat, a book, a house.
- "An" is used before singular, countable nouns that begin with a vowel sound (a, e, i, o, u).  
Example: an apple, an elephant, an umbrella.
- "The" is used when talking about something specific or unique.  
Example: the moon, the sun, the Eiffel Tower.
